Hopefully this will make wine selection easier, and by informing customers how less familiar wines taste, it should also encourage people to try new wines rather than just going for the well known 'brand' regions like Rioja or Sancerre (not that there's anything wrong with that - we have seriously good examples from both regions!).

There is obviously an element of subjectivity in this style of list, as 'medium bodied red' might not mean the same to everyone, and there are arguably some wines which could be on either side of the fence, but largely we feel it is fairly accurate and with that in mind hope that you will enjoy perusing the list and be rewarded with a splendid selection.

Some of our wines would benefit from being decanted, if you would like your wine decanting please bring it to the attention of the staff.

All the wines in this list are supplied by Bowland Forest Vintners, our wine merchants who have their wine shop in the front of the hotel. Now in their 32<sup>nd</sup> year of trading they have a wonderful selection of fine and interesting wines from around the world. All wines chosen are from real winemakers who concentrate on real quality, rather than mass produced 'factory farm' wines. Bowland Forest Vintners offer first rate advice, and back it up with very friendly and efficient service.

We would like to advise that vintages could be liable to change within this list. Whilst we try our best, sometimes we get caught out and therefore we would like to advise that vintages within this list are normally correct and only sometimes wrong!

- 300 1995 Reserve de Leoville Barton, Saint Julien 78.00**  
This is the second wine of Ch. Leoville Barton and with such pedigree quality can hardly come as a surprise. It has all the attributes of its' big brother and offers a beautifully mature glass of claret with garnet hue, cassis fruit and hints of old saddlery.
- 274 1995 Chateau La Lagune, 3eme Cru Haut Medoc 98.00**  
A classic old style Bordeaux which is a favourite of the Inn. Offering lots of black cherry, plum and dark fruit flavours together with some smoky oak and cedar aromas. Drinking very well, with good weight in the mouth, there is lots of life left in this dog!
- 196 1995 Domaine de Chevalier, Pessac Leognan/Graves 100.00**  
In classic Graves style, it is a lovely combo of stony minerality and blackcurrant fruit. Now fully mature it has beautiful aromas and is a joy to drink, offering delicious secondary characteristics with good weight and length.
- 048 1989 Chateau Saint Pierre, 4eme Cru Saint Julien 95.00**  
All the hallmarks of fine Bordeaux from a Chateau which it's true to say flies under the radar. A mature garnet in colour with aromas of blackcurrants, cedar and a hint of mint. Full in the mouth with a lingering finish, it is still drinking very well and a worthy match for roast meats.
- 163 1989 Ch. Meyney, Cru Bourgeois Saint Estephe 95.00**  
Still most youthful and offering superb dark fruit, hints of cedar together with charred meat. It's fantastic to find a Cru Bourgeois which remains as vibrant after 30 years. 1989 was a particular success for this Chateau.
- 227 1988 Chateau Leoville Barton, 2eme Cru Saint Julien 135.00**  
Without doubt one of the finest Houses in the Medoc, consistently producing spectacular wine. Medium bodied and elegant, still with masses of blackcurrant and cherry fruit, with hints of tobacco, sandalwood and a touch of mint. A true gem (and a complete 'steal' at this price!)
- 593 1982 Chateau Grand Puy Lacoste, 5eme Cru Pauillac 165.00**  
One of the finest vintages of last century, and this beautiful wine is a classic example. Another House that if the classifications were renewed would be much higher up the rankings. It still has wonderful cassis aromas, with secondary hints of tobacco and cedar, whilst the palate is silky, smooth and still very much alive and vibrant. This is a treat and offers a truly memorable experience.

## Rhone Valley

- 415 Delas Freres Hermitage Les Bessards 1995, Rhone Valley 120.00**  
Hermitage is the gem of the Northern Rhone and Delas Freres has been going since the mid 1800s. Les Bessards, a single vineyard wine only produced in top vintages is spectacular with delectable aromas of smoky bacon, and hints of tapenade together with lovely dark berry fruit.
- 402 Chateauneuf du Pape 2003 'Cuvee Centenaire', Lucien et Andre Brunel, Rhone Valley 105.00**  
Only made in the best vintages, from a vineyard first planted at the end of 19<sup>th</sup> Century, this is quite simply stunning CNP from one of the best houses in the Rhone. It delivers wonderful aromas of Kirsch, black cherries, licorice, pepper and plums whilst the silky palate offers great length. Powerful and strong, reflecting the vintage. A serious treat worth having!

## Italy

- 517 1999 Marchese di Villamarina, Tenute Sella & Mosca, Sardinia 88.00**  
100% Cabernet Sauvignon from the leading wine producers on Sardinia whose involvement dates back two hundred years. A beautiful garnet colour with enticing aromas of cherries, coffee and with hints of vanilla from the gentle use of oak. Still with good acidity and structure, it has a finish that lingers long in the mouth.
- 574 1996 'Tassinaia' Tenuta del Terriccio - Tuscany 88.00**  
The term 'Super Tuscan' is seen quite often now, whenever a producer uses Bordeaux varietals in their blends. Seldom does it work quite as well as this sexy beast. 1996 was a fabulous vintage with low yields giving concentrated, weighty wines which offer great richness of fruit. With some age, this wine has lost none of its' jaw dropping power and will match most red meat dishes perfectly.
- 515 1999 Barolo 'Brunate' Ceretto Bricco Rocche, Piedmont 95.00**  
A treat for any Barolo aficionado. Fragrant and beautifully balanced. Classically brick red in colour, it is stacked full of rose petal and orange peel along with dark cherry fruit, leather and tar. The oak and fruit are totally integrated, and the flavours are bold.

## Australia

- 965 Wynn's 'Michael' Shiraz 1993, Coonawarra, S. Australia 90.00**  
So often the 'go to' name when it comes to Australia, Wynn's have such consistency you are never disappointed. Michael is only produced in exceptional vintages. Matured in American oak for 18 months, it is rich and complex with mulberry fruit characteristics, with a touch of mocha.
- 648 Howard Park Cabernet Sauvignon Merlot 1992, Western Australia 90.00**  
A top drop, as they say in Aus. The flagship wine from this iconic producer is a sumptuous blend in both grape variety and style, with the dusty earth and blackcurrant aromas of the Mount Barker region combining with the juicy fruit and dark chocolate flavours of the Margaret River. Definitely worth pushing the boat out for!
- 665 Jim Barry 'The Armagh' Shiraz 1996 - Clare Valley, South Australia 150.00**  
The Armagh is one of Australia's iconic wines, very little being made and extremely sought after. We are delighted to be able to list it and we know Aussie aficionados are going to well up when they see it listed! Beautifully balanced, powerful Clare Shiraz with pepper, menthol and spice characteristics underpinned by dark berry fruit, it is still remarkably youthful and is wonderful with any red meat.

## Dessert Wine

- 062 Chateau Doisy Vedrines 1990, Premier Cru Classe, Sauternes (37.5cl) 60.00**  
Sensational effort from one of the best in the business. Unctuous is a word invented for this little beauty, with lip-smacking flavours of apricot, coconut, and hints of flower blossom. You have to treat yourself occasionally.....

## Champagne

- 113 Gallimard Pere et Fils Cuvée Reserve, Brut NV. 47.50**  
A modern hand-made Champagne made from 100% Pinot Noir, grown by the Gallimard family themselves. This allows them to control the quality and price of the fruit which few other producers are able to do. Clean and fresh made in the rounded Gallimard style with a soft, elegant finish.
- 954 Gallimard Pere et Fils Cuvée Reserve, Brut NV. Magnum 95.00**
- 114 Gallimard Pere et Fils Rose, Brut NV. 52.00**  
100% Pinot Noir from fruit grown in the Gallimard vineyards. Bright partridge-eyed rosé in colour with soft red fruit aromas with a gentle mousse and a fleshy finish. A fine aperitif but with enough body and character to accompany sea-fish and poultry.
- 103 Champagne AR Lenoble Brut 'Intense' NV 67.50**  
Intense is absolutely the right word! 100% family owned and independent, owning 18 Ha in three prime locations in Champagne and this particular cuvee is a blend of 40% Chardonnay, 30% Pinot Noir and 30% Pinot Meunier. Sensational flavours of Brioche, nuts and hints of caramel. It has a fine mousse, superb weight and long finish. Awesome value.
- 118 Pol Roger 'White Foil' Brut NV. 78.00**  
This was Sir Winston Churchill's favourite due to the greater use of reserve wines in the final blend, which is made from equal amounts of each of the three Champagne grapes. An exquisite wine which exhibits slight Burgundian mealy notes, with a cleansing silky finish.
- 149 Pol Roger 'White Foil' Brut NV. Magnum 165.00**
- 107 Bollinger Special Cuvee Brut NV. 90.00**  
Classic Bollinger aromas of pears, pastry and hazelnut. Aged for 3 years before disgorgement and then a further 6 months before release it has style and poise and makes for a lovely start to any evening.
- 110 Pol Roger Vintage 2008 135.00**  
True to form Pol have produced another awesome vintage Champagne. Dominated by Pinot Noir, it's beautifully rich with gorgeous fresh baked bread aromas and stone fruit flavours, framed with the elegance that has become the signature of this great house.

- 092 Pol Roger Cuvee Sir Winston Churchill Vintage 2008 185.00**  
Created in homage to Sir Winston Churchill, Pol Roger only produce this very special cuvee in the very best vintages. The exact blend is a specially guarded secret but includes both Pinot Noir and Chardonnay from Grand Cru sites. Full bodied, rich and long, it is very expressive with flavours of peach and almonds.
- 155 Moet et Chandon Dom Perignon Vintage 2009 185.00**  
Rich, intense and creamy, this is a spectacular Champagne. Layer on layer of almonds and hazelnuts, along with lovely tangy citrus flavours of grapefruit. 50% Chardonnay, 34% Pinot Noir, 16% Pinot Meunier. Blissful.

## Sparkling Wine

- 218 Tallero Prosecco Spumante DOC Treviso Extra Dry, Veneto 28.00**  
Delightfully fresh sparkling wine from the Northern Italian region of Veneto. Crisp and fresh with lovely citrus characters.
- 106 Charles Pelletier Grand Reserve Blanc de Blancs, Méthode Traditional, France 29.00**  
Heralding from the Burgundy region, and made by the Champagne method, this excellent sparkling wine is ideal as an aperitif. It is fun, fresh and elegant.
- 211 Charles Pelletier Grand Reserve Rose, Méthode Traditional, France 29.00**  
Made using Shiraz. Fresh and with enough weight and fruit to be enjoyed with or without food.
- 803 Cremant de Limoux, Antech 'Cuvee Eugenie' 2016, Languedoc 35.00**  
A lovely dry wine with tiny bubbles and a beautiful creamy character. The perfect aperitif, it will also go very well with white meats, shellfish and seafood.
- 195 Court Garden Classic Cuvee Brut 2015, East Sussex, Méthode Traditional 57.50**  
Made very much in the style of the sparkling wine from N. France, it has a pretty nose of greengage and apples, with a touch of toast. A beautiful, long finish and a tiny mousse, it is a joy to drink.



## Light and Crisp Whites

- 770 Sauvignon Blanc 2018, Villaricca, Maule Valley (Chile) 21.50**  
Wonderfully crisp with a zingy palate of tropical fruits. Grassy and fresh, this wine offers more than many may expect from Chilean Sauvignon. Really enjoyable.
- 326 Pinot Grigio 2018, La Borgata - Veneto (Italy) 22.50**  
We sell buckets of this lovely modern Pinot Grigio from Italy's NW. Fresh and crisp, it has gorgeous aromas of pears and apples and a full flavour and pronounced fruit.
- 305 Sauvignon de Touraine 2018, Domaine de Rablais (Loire) 24.50**  
Downstream from the famous Villages of Sancerre and Pouilly comes this wonderfully expressive, zesty Sauvignon with gorgeous crisp flavours on both nose and palate which make your mouth water just to think about them! As a drink on its' own or with food, it is a delight.
- 338 Muscadet 'Sur Lie' Sevre et Maine 2017, Domaine Bigotiere (Loire) 25.00**  
Finally Muscadet is making a come back! World renowned as the true match for 'Fruits de Mers' – Seafood to you and me. It disappeared off wine radars with the New World invasion. Beautifully dry with a touch of complexity from the lees treatment.
- 385 Picpoul de Pinet 2018 Villa des Croix, Languedoc 27.50**  
Having shed its' 'Muscadet of the south' tag Picpoul de Pinet now stands on its' own feet and continues to clean up in the dry white stakes. Villa des Croix is one of the very best. Fresh and lemony, this is a dry white that everyone can get along with perfectly.
- 994 Albarino Calazul 2018, Rias Baixas (Spain) 28.50**  
Albarino is the indigenous grape of Rias Baixas in Galicia, North-West Spain. Regarded as Spain's alternative to Viognier in terms of its fresh peachy aromatics. Very popular in Madrid's chic bars and restaurants.
- 530 Gavi DOCG 2018, Sassaia (Piedmont) 33.00**  
Beautifully clean and fresh, with hints of peach and white flower aromas, it's easy to see why this wine is so popular. Perfect wine for lighter style dishes and seafood.
- 256 Chablis 2018, Domaine Hamelin, Burgundy 39.50**  
This is a superb, traditional style Chablis with the typical flinty, mineral characteristics. Quite light in style, this does not pretend to be a big, buttery Côte d'Or wine. The company is a firm believer in not using oak in order to give full purity of fruit and expression of terroir.

- 331 Sancerre 2018, Domaine Andre Dezat, Loire Valley 39.50**  
100% Sauvignon Blanc. Fresh cut grass and elderflower on the nose with an exquisitely rich palate of gooseberries and citrus, combined with minerally flintiness. A classic which lives up to its' reputation as the great fish dish match.
- 329 Pouilly Fumé 2018, Domaine du Petit Soumade, Loire Valley 42.00**  
From way up stream on the Loire, on the opposite side of the river from Sancerre is this other iconic wine region. A stalwart of wine lists all over the world, it is Sauvignon Blanc as we used to know. Crisp, fresh with hints of gooseberries and an underlying smokiness this appellation is known for.

## Medium to Full Bodied Whites

- 715 Chenin Blanc 2014 Zevenwacht, Stellenbosch, South Africa 23.50**  
Chenin Blanc is S. Africa's leading white grape, and this particular one is ideal with or without food. Fermented in oak and kept on its' lees it is awesome value with good depth of flavour, and has gorgeous aromas and a long finish.
- 744 Chardonnay 2018 Gran Reserva, Nostros - Casablanca, Chile 27.50**  
If anybody is still dragging their feet when it comes to getting back onto the Chardonnay bandwagon, just point them at this little gem. Winds off the Pacific keep the vineyards cool thereby slowing ripening. The result is a Chardonnay of elegance. Barrel fermented for extra complexity, it is exceptionally pleasing.
- 499 Dom Rafael 2017 Herdade do Mouchao, Alentejo (Portugal) 32.00**  
A Unoaked but kept on its' lees for 6 months, this is a gorgeously fresh and citrus style blend, with mouth-watering vibrant aromas of grapefruit, and tropical fruits, just right for combating Atlantic seafood, or as a delicious aperitif.
- 238 Macon Solutre 2018, Domaine Denuziller, Burgundy 32.50**  
Elegant and fresh, this wine from Solutre, one of the best villages in the Maconnais, is very pleasing. Fruit driven with no oak, but the lees is stirred giving extra complexity. A real crowd pleaser which is great value.
- 806 Chardonnay 2016 Foxglove, Central Coast (California) 38.50**  
The Varner brothers have produced an absolute beauty with the emphasis on fruit, so there is very little oak influence at all. There are lovely notes of flowers, honeysuckle and hints of white peach. It is elegant and restrained, quite un-Californian, but we love it!

- 726 Chenin / Viognier 2015 'Saskia', Miles Mossop, W. Cape (S. Africa) 46.50**  
A fulsome blend, with aromas of white peaches, and flavours of quince and apricots. Very rich with a lovely balance between fruit and acidity. Absolutely ideal for fish, with or without sauce.
- 362 Pouilly Loche 'Les Barres' 2016, Clos de Rocs, Burgundy 49.50**  
An iconic wine from a small producer based in Loche. The whole of Pouilly Loche AC is only 32 Hectares of which Clos de Rocs own 30%. Very well balanced it has a perfumed, elegant and honeyed nose with great stone fruit and citrus flavours and a pleasing saline minerality.
- 079 Chablis 1er Cru Cote de Lechet 2018, Domaine Defaix, Burgundy 54.50**  
From 100% Chardonnay, full bodied yet with elegant fruit backed up by minerals and good acidity known by the French as 'gout de pierre a fusil', or gunflint. Superb length, it really is classy stuff.
- 257 Bourgogne Blanc 2015, Domaine Paul Pillot 56.00**  
A great illustration of how good 2015 was for white Burgundies. Handpicked fruit from just outside Chassagne Montrachet, pressed and kept on its' lees for a year with just a touch of oak, it has loads of white peach fruit with hints of grapefruit underpinned by some chalky minerality. Anyone would think they'd got the wrong labels on!
- 233 Chassagne Montrachet 2017, Dom. Bachey Legros, Burgundy 82.50**  
Lovely pale straw in colour, with mouth watering aromas of peaches. Juicy and ripe, with gentle a touch of oak, this is a delicious Burgundy. Whether roast pork, chicken or sea bass this is your ideal combo.
- 279 Puligny Montrachet 2017, Domaine Pernet Belicard, Burgundy 85.00**  
Quintessential Burgundy from the world famous appellation. Lovely balanced Chardonnay fruit from the best vineyards. Elegant with a citrus and stone fruit palate and lemon meringue characters. Sensational with fish.
- 246 Meursault 'Les Criots' 2016, Dom. Ballot Millot, Burgundy 86.50**  
Superb quality 'Lieu Dit' which means basically single vineyard, from one of the region's leading lights. A year in oak, then left in stainless steel with very little intervention. Heaps of sensational stone fruit, cashew and toast and honey and cracking acidity. Beautifully situated vineyards, low yields and brilliant winemaking all contribute to this very special bottle.
- 278 Puligny Montrachet 2010 1er Cru Clavaillon, Domaine Leflaive, Burgundy 185.00**  
Another stupendous wine from Burgundy's leading producers. Gorgeous aromas of acacia flower, white peach, hints of pear together with toast and honey and a touch of vanilla on the palate. This is absolutely delicious, and is the perfect match for most fish dishes.

## Aromatic and Fruity Whites

- 848 Riesling 2018, Dr. Loosen, Mosel (Germany) 26.50**  
This is what you would expect from top quality Riesling. Medium dry, with a fresh, zesty nose and a mouth-watering, fruity palate.
- 457 Viognier '974' 2018, Ch. Pesquie, Rhone Valley 27.50**  
The number in the name is the road which takes you to the vineyard....you can't deny the French are romantic!! Nevertheless, the wine speaks for itself. Aromatic and alluring, beautiful apricot and peach flavours abound, and the fruit on the palate lingers on and on.....
- 694 Riesling 2015, Mount Langhi 'Billi Billi', Grampians, Victoria (Aus.) 27.50**  
Classic cool climate Riesling flavours leap from the glass, making your mouth water before you even have a sip! Lemon and limes, together with lovely floral overtones. Wonderful with fish and an especially good partner to Asian influenced food. Yum!
- 038 Sauvignon Blanc 2018, Staete Landt, Marlborough (NZ) 30.00**  
Staete Landt is the name given to what is now New Zealand by Tasman, the Dutch explorer in honour of his country. Wonderfully fresh and powerful on the nose this is an intense wine with bags of zesty gooseberry passion fruit and citrus fruit and great concentration of flavour.
- 365 Gewurztraminer Reserve 2017, Joseph Cattin, Alsace 36.50**  
A classic Gewurztraminer from Alsace exhibiting lychees and Turkish delight aromas, very intense, unctuous flavours with delicious texture as a result of the old vines. So tasty you will adore it.
- 579 Tenuta di Castellaro Porticello 2017, IGT Sicily 38.00**  
This captivating wine is from the island of Lipari just off Sicily has instant appeal leaping from the glass. Made from Carricante and Moscato grown on the volcanic soil, it is intensely flavoured with stunning aromas of apples, honey and white flowers. It's well balanced and long.
- 503 Pinot Gris 2016, Dom. Rolly Gassman, Alsace 46.50**  
Truly, truly unctuous! Packed full of spiced citrus, toffee apple, peach and apricot aromas, backed up with a hint of spice on the palate, Off dry, rich and complex, it is God's gift to Spicy cuisine.

## Rose Wines

- 386 Ch Pesquie 'Terrasses' Ventoux 2017, Rhone Valley 26.50**  
From the slopes of Mt Ventoux. With a charming peachy orange colour and with aromas of summer fruits, it is pure elegance in a glass. Ideal as an aperitif, it has good weight and goes amazingly well with many foods.
- 346 Sancerre Rose 2018, Andre Dezat - Loire 38.50**  
A wonderful alternative for an aperitif or a delightful wine to go with fish. From Pinot Noir grapes, it is delicate yet complex. Simply delicious!

## Elegant and Lighter Bodied Reds

- 774 Merlot 2018, Villarrica, Maule Valley (Chile) 21.50**  
A no nonsense wine, precisely what you should expect from a Chilean of this level. Full of plums and red fruits with mild tannins and light to medium body, an ideal prescription for the easy drinker.
- 372 Carignan Vieilles Vignes 2018, Mont Rocher, Pays Herault (Languedoc) 23.50**  
The old vines of the hills of Languedoc provide this juicy little wine with extra depth, but it is so easy to drink. Smooth and soft, it's a bigger crowd pleaser than Michael Buble.
- 144 Chateau Roc de Segur 2017, Bordeaux 24.50**  
Merlot dominant (65%) Bordeaux with generous plummy flavours on the palate, and hints of blackcurrants and a touch of spicy earth. Easy drinking with good weight, it suits fowl, red meat and game equally well.
- 358 Beaujolais Villages 2016, Domaine Colette, Beaujolais 31.50**  
Pure, concentrated Gamay fruit of Cru Beaujolais quality. Clear, bright with deep colour extract and mouth-filling flavours.
- 662 Pinot Noir 2018, Paper Road, Wairarapa (NZ) 32.50**

- 328 Fleurie 2018, Domaine Manoir Carra, Beaujolais 34.50**  
Classic Cru Beaujolais. A fresh fruit forward and silky wine full of ripe strawberry and cherry fruit, underpinned by more body than would be found in your humble Beaujolais Villages.
- 332 Sancerre Rouge 2018, Domaine Andre Dezat, Loire 39.50**

A delicious claret from a magical vintage. Cabernet Sauvignon is the main grape (60%) in this classic Bordeaux blend. Elegant and stylish, it is not a cutlass, rather an epee but still has blackcurrant and cedar flavours and is unmistakably Medoc.
- 207 Chateau Siaurac 2014, Lalande de Pomerol (Bordeaux) 54.50**  
80% Merlot reminds us this is indeed from the Pomerol plateau, home to some of the best right bank clarets. A fruit forward nose of cassis, cherry and tobacco, backed up with a weighty yet balanced palate and long finish. Already drinking superbly, the longer it's in the glass the more joy you get!
